In this regard, the company's management is responsible for planning, organising, implementing, communicating and maintaining the company's Health and Safety Management System, as well as all the standards established in this area, committing to the elimination of hazards and the reduction of health and safety risks.

It is essential that all FCC Industrial staff, subcontractors and suppliers receive information, training, instruction and supervision to work safely and manage health and safety within their area of responsibility. Furthermore, all employees have a duty to protect their own health, safety and well-being, and that of others who may be affected by their activities.

As part of our ongoing commitment, the entire organisation must comply with the requirements set out in the applicable legislation in force in each country, as well as with internal regulations, codes of good practice and standards defined within the relevant industry.

With a view to effectively integrating management practices and improving working conditions, objectives are set and a plan is drawn up on an annual basis.

Communication and the management of information regarding occupational health and safety are considered essential for effective management. Consequently, the results of health and safety management must be communicated and made known clearly and transparently throughout the organisation, facilitating consultation and the involvement of employees in all aspects of health and safety. Similarly, collaboration on health and safety with our customers, suppliers and subcontractors is a fundamental pillar of FCC Industrial.

The commitment to continuous improvement entails all activities being regularly audited in accordance with the Health and Safety Management System.

Healthy working environments will be promoted, as well as healthy habits among employees both at work and outside work.

Throughout this continuous and integrated process, the health and safety organisation will provide advice and support to ensure compliance with obligations in this area by the line management. To this end, the Management will allocate the appropriate resources and qualified personnel to achieve a high level of health and safety.

All company managers are responsible for ensuring that this Policy is disseminated, implemented and known to all company employees, and that it is made available to other interested parties.
